The Committee considered The Women's Tour which would be briefly passing Wallingford on the afternoon of 11th June 2022 as part of the sixth and final stage. The event was being televised. Local business owners had been notified of the event by the District Council.

RESOLVED that a branded, re-usable 'Welcome to Wallingford' banner be created and hung, provided the Town Clerk is agreeable, and that action be taken to alert those who normally park on the High Street outside the Kinecroft and the Museum, of the event.

48/22 RIVERSIDE WORKING PARTY

Councillors Cattermole and Whelan updated the meeting on the Riverside Working Party, including the cost of replacing the cast-iron mooring cleats, engagement with River Users' Group 3, contact with the Centre for Ecology & Hydrology, the erosion of the beach, the potential expansion of the moorings to the north and the flotilla that would be part of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

RESOLVED that the approval of the cost of replacing the cast-iron mooring cleats – likely to be in the region of £1k - be sought from the Full Council
